## VEGETABLES

### Section A Classes 1 - 12

1. Five potatoes (any variety/colour)
2. Three onions over 8 oz (dressed)
3. Three leeks (with roots)
4. Three courgettes
5. Five red tomatoes
6. Three beetroot (with 3 inch tops)
7. Three carrots (with 3 inch tops)
8. Six runner beans
9. Heaviest marrow
10. Heaviest onion
11. Longest runner bean
12. A collection of different vegetables in a basket

## FLOWERS

### Section C Classes 17-25

17. A vase of Roses - three blooms
18. A single rose (no leaves, thorns or spikes)
19. Three blooms of dahlias
20. A vase of asters
21. A vase of Gladioli - three spikes
22. A vase of cut flowers from the garden
23. Five sweet peas in a vase (straight stems)
24. One orchid to take to someone in hospital
25. One pot plant with foliage

## FRUIT

### Section B Classes 13-16

13. Four dessert apples
14. Four cooking apples
15. Berry fruits (paper plates of six)
16. Any other fruit

## FLORAL ART

### Section D Classes 26-29

*(Maximum size for floral arrangements 24" x 24", height unlimited)*

27. A jug or vase of mixed flowers of at least four varieties (Sweet Williams?)
28. A small table centre in ceramic up to 12" or 30cms in diameter
29. An arrangement in a breakfast cup and saucer to include lavender and roses and foliage



**HOUSE AND HOME****Section E** Classes 30 – 42

30. Six decorated cupcakes (men only)
31. Make a pound cake (recipe below)
32. Six blueberry muffins
33. A Lemon Meringue Pie
34. Soda bread (recipe below)
35. Six wholemeal rolls
36. Jar of fruit jam (1lb approx)
37. Jar of lemon curd (1lb approx.)
38. Jar of homemade chutney (1lb approx)
39. Bottle of homemade cordial
40. A hand knitted or crocheted baby blanket

**FAMILY ENTRY****Section H** Classes 48

**WINES AND CIDERS****Section G** Classes 43-47

*Exhibitor MUST have made all exhibits. Exhibits to be staged in clear labelled bottles (not spirit bottles) with corks drawn for judging.*

43. Bottle of homemade wine from a fruit
44. Bottle of homemade wine from a flower
45. Bottle of homemade wine from a root
46. Bottle of homemade liqueur
47. Bottle of homemade cider





## **POUND CAKE**

*100g glacé cherries, 225g softened butter, 225g light muscovado sugar, 4 large eggs, 225g SR flour, 225g raisins, 225g sultanas, 1 level tsp mixed spice, 1 tbsp brandy*

Grease and line a 20cm round cake tin. Cut cherries in to quarters and rinse and dry well. Measure all ingredients into a large bowl and beat together until thoroughly combined and place in prepared tin. Bake in pre-heated oven 150C/Fan 130C/Gas 2 for 2-21/4 hours.

## **SODA BREAD**

*1¾ oz (50g) unsalted butter, cubed, plus extra for greasing  
8oz (225g) plain wholemeal flour, plus extra for dusting  
8oz (225g) plain white flour or spelt flour  
3 fl oz (75ml) whole milk  
9¼ fl oz (285ml) buttermilk  
2 tsp bicarbonate of soda  
Pinch of salt*

*Preheat the oven to 220C/425F/Gas mark 7. Grease a baking sheet. Sift the flours and bicarbonate of soda into a bowl, tipping in the grain left in the sieve. Add the butter and rub in with your fingertips until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add the buttermilk and milk and mix to a soft dough, adding a dash more milk if the dough is dry. Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured surface and shape into a ball. Place it on the prepared baking sheet, flatten slightly and sprinkle with extra flour. Using a floured knife, make a deep cut across the top of the dough. Make a second cut in the opposite direction. Bake the bread in the oven for 35 minutes or until risen and it sounds hollow when the base is tapped. Transfer to a wire rack to cool.*

5. Certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in class. There will also be a number of cups awarded (see list above).
6. Competitors must provide their own 10 inch paper plates and vases to exhibit their items.
7. Points will be awarded as follows - 5 pts for 1st prize, 3 pts for 2nd prize, 2 points for 3rd prize.
8. Individual entries only unless specified.
9. Children cannot enter any adult classes unless specified.
